Dear Chairwoman Vigil-Masten,

In 2001, with unanimous support of the President's Native American Advisory Council and endorsed by President Dave Frohnmayer, the Hoopa Valley Tribe were included in the University of Oregon's Residency by Aboriginal Right Program. All enrolled members of your nation are eligible for in-state tuition regardless if they live out-of-state. This is a savings of approximately \$20,000 per year.

This letter serves to reaffirm our commitment to the Hoopa Valley Tribe allowing all enrolled tribal members to attend the University of Oregon at "in-state" tuition rates. A copy of this letter will be placed in the Office of Admissions to serve as a reminder of our long-standing commitment to your nation.
