Trinity River High Flows to Continue

To protect adult salmon entering the Klamath and Trinity rivers from risk of a fish kill, the Bureau of Reclamation will continue higher than average releases from Lewiston Dam into late September 2015. These protective releases come at the request of the Hoopa Valley Tribe, Humboldt County and others.

Flows in Hoopa Valley will hold near current levels, with the potential to increase substantially in coming weeks for brief periods, depending on fish disease conditions in lower Klamath. The potential increases could come in early September or later, based on monitoring of fish and river condition.

People are advised to use caution, as the Trinity River remains higher and cooler than usual for this time of year. Further information will be made available as conditions warrant.
