Dear Mr. Mendes:

We have completed the final review of the *Hoopa Valley Tribe Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan 2018*, officially adopted by the Hoopa Valley Tribe on July 18, 2019, and found the plan to be in conformance with Title 44 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 201.7 *Tribal Mitigation Plans*.

The approval of this plan ensures the Hoopa Valley Tribe's continued eligibility for project grants under FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Assistance programs, including Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, Pre-Disaster Mitigation Program, and Flood Mitigation Assistance Program, as well as Public Assistance (Categories C-G). All requests for funding, however, will be evaluated individually according to the specific eligibility and other requirements of the particular program under which applications are submitted.

FEMA's approval of *Hoopa Valley Tribe Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan 2018* is for a period of five years, effective starting the date of this letter. Prior to November 7, 2024, the Hoopa Valley Tribe is required to review and revise its plan to reflect changes in development, progress in local mitigation efforts, and changes in priorities, and resubmit it for approval in order to continue to be eligible for mitigation project grant funding. The enclosed plan review tool provides additional recommendations to incorporate into the plan when the Tribe undertakes its identified plan maintenance process.
