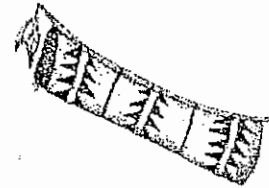

We are sorry for the loss of your loved one, and we are here to provide you with assistance to help you and your family during this difficult time.

The Hoopa Valley Tribe will pay for funeral expenses up to \$ 5,800. Documentation must be provided (tribal roll number of the deceased), with the application before receiving funds. All funeral homes will be paid directly by the Hoopa Valley Tribe. Please have the funeral home director contact the Hoopa Valley Tribe for additional information @ (530) 625-4211.

Please fill out the form. A \$500 check will be provided to the appropriate family member, who is either a spouse of the deceased (marriage certificate may be required), or whoever the family has delegated to be in charge of making the arrangements. The \$500 check can be used for flowers, food, or however you deem as appropriate.

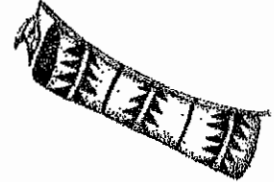

While the CDC continues to recommend avoiding large events and gatherings. Currently, CDC, or the Hoopa Valley Tribes Revised Alert Level System, does not provide numbers to define small and large events. Allowing for special events (Graduations, District Meetings, Funerals), Hoopa Tribal OES has developed this Safety Plan to cover special events moving forward that may be held at Pooky's Park, the NF Lawn, or NF Gym. The guidelines are as follows:

Neighborhood Facilities (Gym),

CDC does not have a limit or recommend a specific number of attendees for these types of events and instead encourages event organizers to focus on ways to limit people's contact with each other. Each event organizer will need to determine the appropriate number for their setting in collaboration with local health officials. For inside the Neighborhood Facilities (Gym), this number has been determined to be 80. This number has been chosen to allow individuals to remain at least 6 feet apart from each other and reduce and limit contact between attendees, staff, and others. In general, the more people you interact with, the more closely you interact with them, and the longer that interaction, the higher your risk of getting and spreading COVID-19. Indoor spaces are more risky than outdoor spaces because indoors, it can be harder to keep people at least 6 feet apart and the ventilation is not as good as it is outdoors.

Pooky's Park, Neighborhood Facilities Lawn,

CDC continues to recommend avoiding large events and gatherings. Currently, CDC or the revised Alert Level System of the Hoopa Valley Tribe does not provide numbers to define small and large events. If events are to be hosted in these areas, social distancing guidelines still need to be followed. The guidelines are as follows:

Use social distancing, stay at least 6 feet from people you don't live with ("social distancing") at all times. Avoid gathering with people you don't live with. Avoid crowded parks. Do not visit parks where you cannot stay at least 6 feet away from people you don't live with.

Wear a mask as feasible. Masks are most essential in times when social distancing is difficult. Masks should not be placed on children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, and anyone who is unconscious, can't move, or is otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance. Masks should not be worn when engaging in activities where the mask might become wet, like when swimming.

Clean hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom, before eating, and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. Adults and older children who can safely use hand sanitizer: Use hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol and rub hands together until dry, if soap and water are not readily available.

And finally, stay home if you are sick

This Safety Plan is part of the Use Permit Application and will need to be signed and filed with application. Signed copies will need to be filed with the Office of Emergency Services, Safety Officer.
